Grafton has an established Environmental Management System with the principal aim of maintaining environmental improvements within the business.

To continue improving environmental management, Grafton is committed to the following:

- The prevention/reduction of pollution and the continual improvement of our environmental management system.
- Efficient and effective use of natural resources, such as fossil fuels and water, using renewable electricity and transitioning to alternative bio-fuels where practicable.
- Establishing net zero Science Based Targets for Greenhouse Gas Emissions across our value chain (Scopes 1, 2 and 3 by 2050) and planning improvement measures to reduce our carbon emissions in line with these targets.
- Reduce the amount of waste sent to landfill by re-using waste wherever possible, reducing single use plastics and increasing the recycling that takes place in our branch network and through our waste contractors.
- Including environmental considerations in investment decisions and financial planning.
- Supporting the development of new products to help our customers reduce their environmental impact
- Working with our supply chain to ensure that we purchase products and materials from businesses who share our commitment to sustainability wherever possible.
- Encouraging suppliers to pursue their own improvement programmes to reduce their environmental impact and carry out life cycle assessments to understand the environmental impact products have throughout their life and using this information to reduce their impact.
- Looking for opportunities to develop a circular economy through our business operations
- Improving the environmental awareness of our colleagues and contractors through training courses and awareness campaigns.
- Recognising the impact we have on local communities and other interested parties, consulting with them where appropriate and minimising any activities that may negatively affect them.
- Complying with all applicable legislation and any identified good practice.
